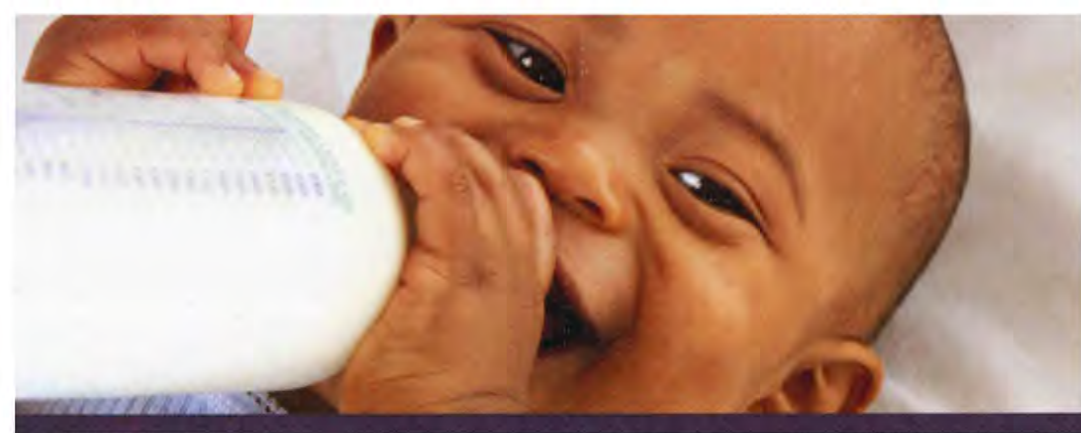

What is Every Child Succeeds?

For ten years, Every Child Succeeds has been changing the story of child development in Southwest Ohio and Northern Kentucky. Working with 14 provider agencies, Every Child Succeeds® implements two national home visitation models: Healthy Families America® (13 provider sites) and Nurse Family Partnership® (one provider site). Through highly structured in-home visits, we've been preparing new mothers for the work of a lifetime – instilling vital parenting skills, education, safety, and medical and nutritional insight – nurturing a vital link of infant care within our most at-risk families. In fact, we were able to serve 3,169 families in 2010. The outcomes of this program are measurable and profound.

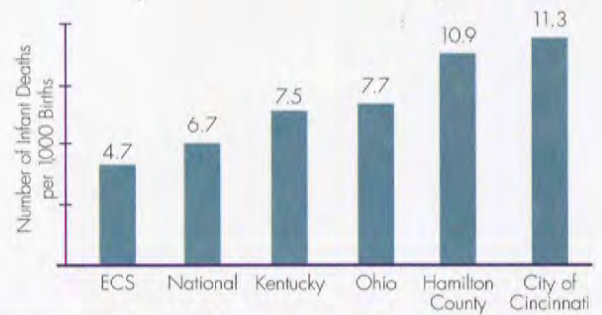


Less likely to die as infants

Fact: Children enrolled in Every Child Succeeds are 60% less likely to die as infants.

Infant mortality is considered a primary indicator of public health. Relative to other industrialized nations, the U.S. ranks 31st in infant mortality with higher risk among African American children. ECS home visits focusing on prenatal health and nutrition have had a significant impact on infant mortality in our community.

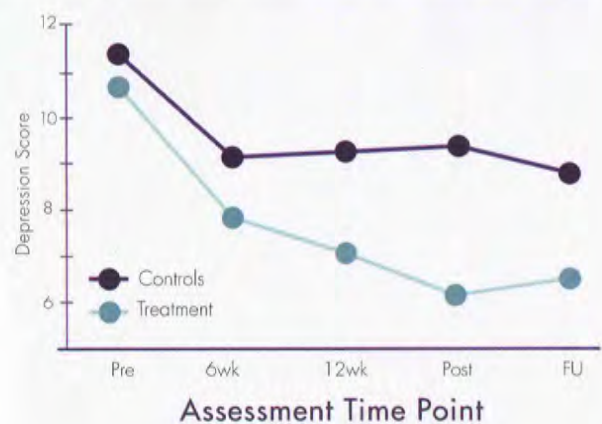
Updated Infant Mortality Rates



Depressed moms get better, create healthy home environments

Fact: Mothers with depression who enroll in Every Child Succeeds respond to innovative treatment and create emotionally healthy environments.

Young children exposed to maternal depression are often impaired in their social relationships. They are also likely to have attention and concentration problems, struggle with learning, and often require special education. ECS developed the first treatment specifically for depressed mothers in home visitation. This graph shows a drop in depressive symptoms (up to 30%) in depressed mothers receiving the treatment in comparison to those who did not receive treatment or were treated in the community.

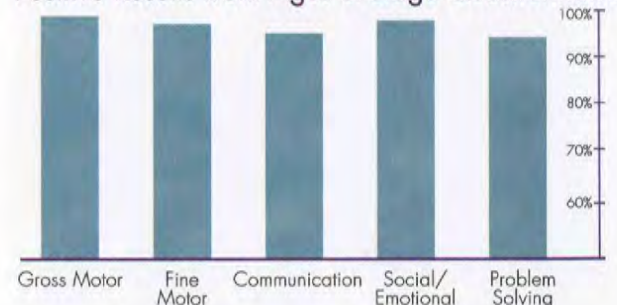


Functioning in the normal range

Fact: More than 90% of children in Every Child Succeeds are on-track developmentally.

Optimizing child development is a key objective of Every Child Succeeds. The majority of children in ECS are functioning in the normal range of development for gross motor, fine motor, language and interpersonal skills. Delays are associated with continued health adjustment and learning problems through elementary schools.

2010 Program Statistics and Outcomes



For many years, Every Child Succeeds has tracked program outcomes that reflect key aspects of child, mother and family functioning. Considered essential for optimal child development, these factors include social and emotional health, cognitive development, physical health and behavioral adjustment – all of which contribute to school readiness and success through childhood. Below are statistics that represent both the community served and successes achieved.



Families served are at risk

- 94% Parents are unmarried
- 95% Parents are within the low income bracket
- 24% Parents are younger than 18
- 34% Parents have inadequate prenatal care
- 85% Parents have social challenges (isolation, mental illness, substance abuse)

Children are thriving in a stimulating environment

- 97% Parents are responsive to their child's learning and emotional needs
- 92% Parents' interactions with child are positive and accepting
- 98% Parents organize child's care, outings and home environment
- 97% Home has appropriate learning materials to stimulate development
- 96% Parents are actively involved in their child's learning
- 99% Child's daily life includes some variety of people and events

Children are on target in all areas

- 97% Gross Motor Development
- 96% Fine Motor Development
- 95% Language Development
- 96% Social/Emotional Development
- 94% Problem Solving Development

Children and mothers are safe and healthy

- 67% Two-year olds with immunizations up-to-date
- 99% Children with a medical home
- 95% Children with a safe play environment
- 66% Mothers who initiated breast-feeding
- 18% Mothers who reduced or quit smoking
- 57% Mothers whose depression has improved
